

## Louisiana, Is This Who We Want to Be?

FACT: Louisiana Child Death Rate from Assault is More Than Twice the National Average.



From 1999 to 2019, Louisiana's child death rate from assault, 4.6 per 100,000, was more than two times the national average of 2.11. For more than twenty years, Louisiana's children have been twice as likely to die from assault as children among other states.

Louisiana's rate of child deaths by assault increased to 5.3 during 2019, which is greater than Louisiana's average of 4.6 for the period of 1999 through 2019. Rather than declining from the nation's highest average rate of 4.6, Louisiana's rate of child deaths by assault increased to 5.3 in 2019, which is 13.2% greater than our state's 20-year average.
